METHODOLOGY NOTE



Objectives

The key aims of this research were to:

- Understand attitudes towards the UK's energy mix, and the role tidal energy could play in this:
- Measurement of attitudes towards the Swansea Bay Tidal Lagoon among Conservative councillors and MPs:
- Explore attitudes towards . the Swansea Bay Tidal Lagoon in detail.

Method

ComRes surveyed 303 Conservative councillors online, and 150 MPs using a combination of paper and February – 15th March 2016. online surveys.

Fieldwork dates

MPs fieldwork was conducted between 25th February – 6th April 2016.



Interpretation

Data have been weighted by region to be representative of Conservative councillors and the House of Commons.

With a sample size of 303 Conservative councillors, the margin of error on results at a 95% confidence level is \pm 5.53. Differences of less than this should be treated as indicative.

With a sample size of 150 MPs, the margin of error on results at a 95% confidence level is \pm 7.02. Differences of less that this should be treated as indicative.

Findings marked with an asterisk (*) indicate a low base size. These results should be treated with caution.


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Awareness of and support for Swansea Bay Tidal Lagoon are high	Three quarters of Conservative councillors and nine in ten Conservative MPs say they have heard about the Swansea Bay Tidal Lagoon, and just under half of councillors and two-thirds of Conservative MPs say they know at least a little about it. Support for construction of the Swansea Bay Tidal Lagoon is very high, with more than four in five saying they support the project among both Conservative MPs and councillors. Conservative councillors think that solar and tidal are the power sources that could most credibly be integrated into the UK's low carbon system; Conservative MPs think the most credible source tested is tidal power.
Conservatives are positive on long-term prospects for Swansea Bay Tidal Lagoon	The vast majority of Conservative councillors and MPs see Swansea Bay Tidal Lagoon as a first step with the potential to provide a secure, long-term source of power. Both audiences generally say they believe that the cost to consumers could be managed, as could any environmental impacts. Majorities of both audiences are also convinced that construction would open up new UK supply chain opportunities.
There is a clear mandate to focus on reducing costs in the longer-term	The vast majority of Conservative councillors and MPs say they think subsidies should be used to help new technologies become competitive, and a majority also think that the UK should invest now in the interests of developing cheaper energy in future rather than prioritising an immediate reduction in costs.
Priorities for UK generation facilities are aligned with expectations on what tidal power would deliver	For both Conservative MPs and councillors, the top priorities for UK generation facilities to deliver are producing power for the long-term, and providing a reliable power source. These are also the attributes tested most likely to be associated with tidal power. The next most important priority for councillors is to produce power at a competitive price, which is the fourth most likely to be selected as most important attribute for Conservative MPs, after producing a large amount of power. These are both attributes that only minorities of both audiences say apply to tidal power.






MPs' support for construction of the Swansea Bay Tidal Lagoon:

















RELIABILITY AND LONG-TERM PRODUCTION RANKED OF HIGHEST IMPORTANCE BY MPS OVERALL




% MPs that rank each in their top three most important to a UK generation facility:




PRIORITIES FOR GENERATION BY ASSOCIATION WITH TIDAL POWER AMONG COUNCILLORS

Showing % selecting each as a top 3 priority by attributes Conservative councillors associate with tidal power:


